
Practical Heraldry for the Self-Isolator Week 8E— Lines of Partition


Heraldry is often made more interesting if the shapes which break up the shield are captured in other than straight lines—here are some of the commonest such treatments of lines of partition:





Galloway 1909

Here we see an example of the Scottish practice of indicating *cadency*—descent from younger son of the armiger—by means of a *bordure engrailed*.



Burgh of Oldmeldrum 1954

In these arms, the fess embattled in chief and wavy in base is clearly designed, especially with the two supporting pallets to represent a picture of a bridge.




Stodart 1871

In the 1st and 4th quarters, we see a fess nebuly




