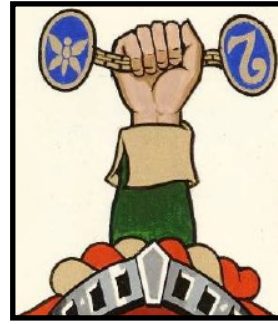
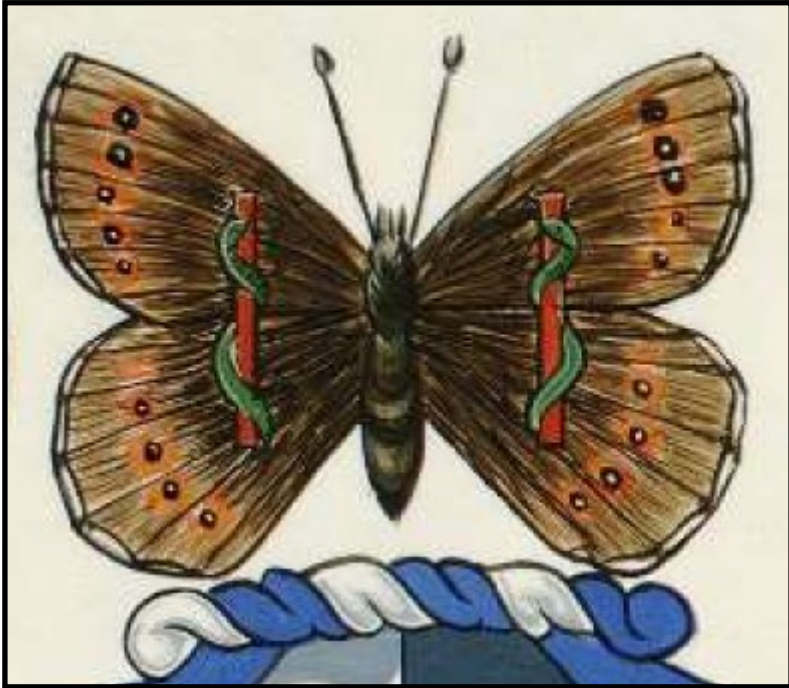




Beastie 2: The **BUTTERFLY, SPIDER, SCARAB & DRAGONFLY**



The butterfly on the left is a Scottish *Argus* “*Erebia aethiops*) with a rod of Aesculapius on each wing, an ancient symbol of medicine. The crest above is also for a medical man and has butterfly on one of the cufflinks while the gold butterfly on this cross, called a cross moline, again represents a doctor.

Here is its friend (*Tinker, 73/28*)

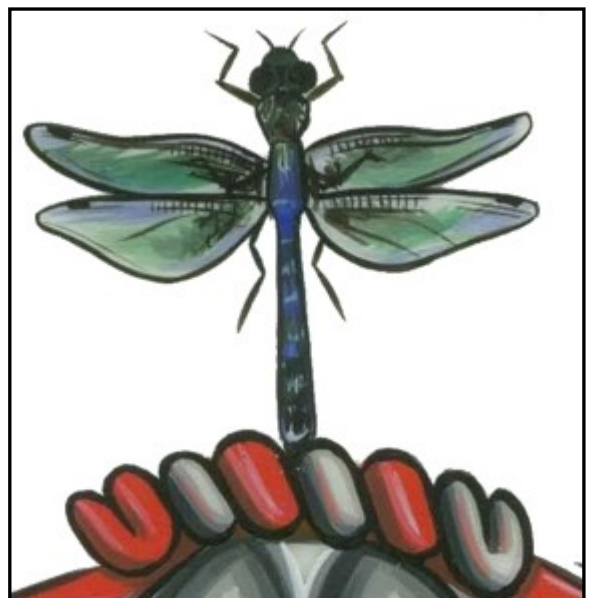
The story of Robert the Bruce gaining encouragement from the spider’s refusal to stop trying makes it almost another Scottish symbol.



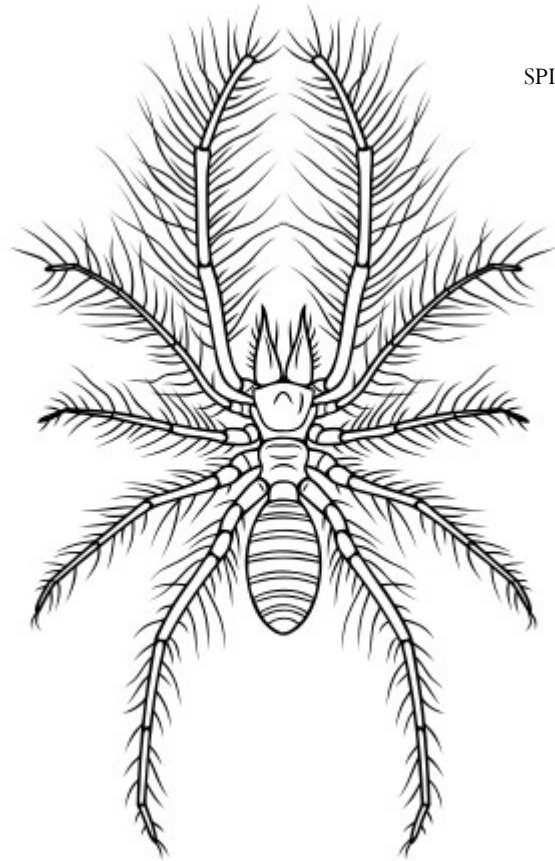
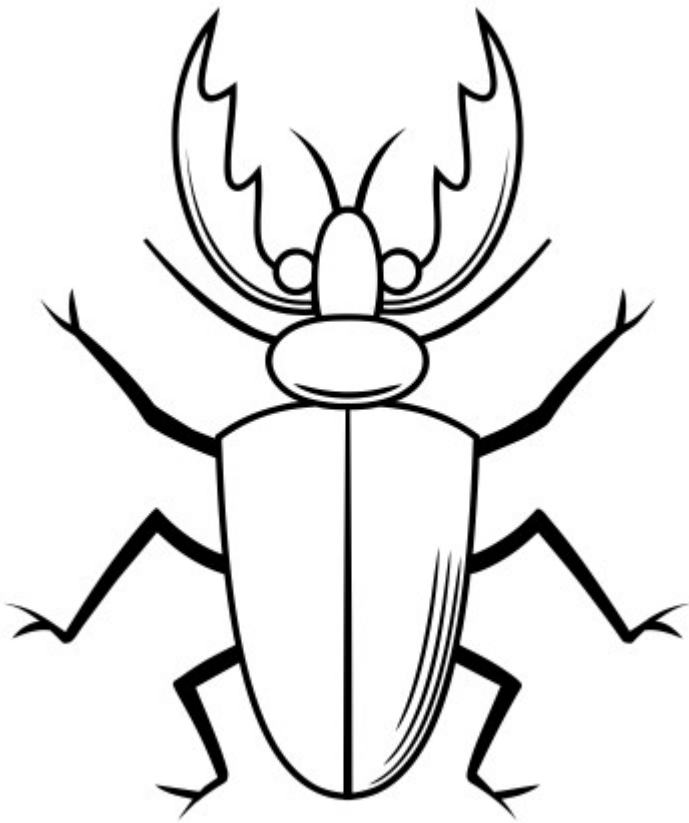
Watch out, there is a scarab beetle hiding under these two quill pens.....

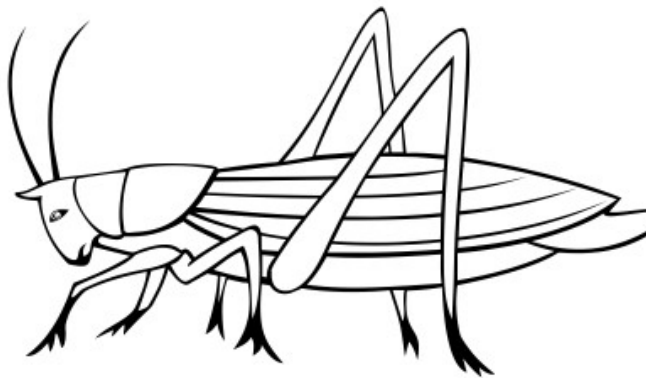
Look at the translucent loveliness of this green darter dragonfly crest. (*McAlpin 90,65*)



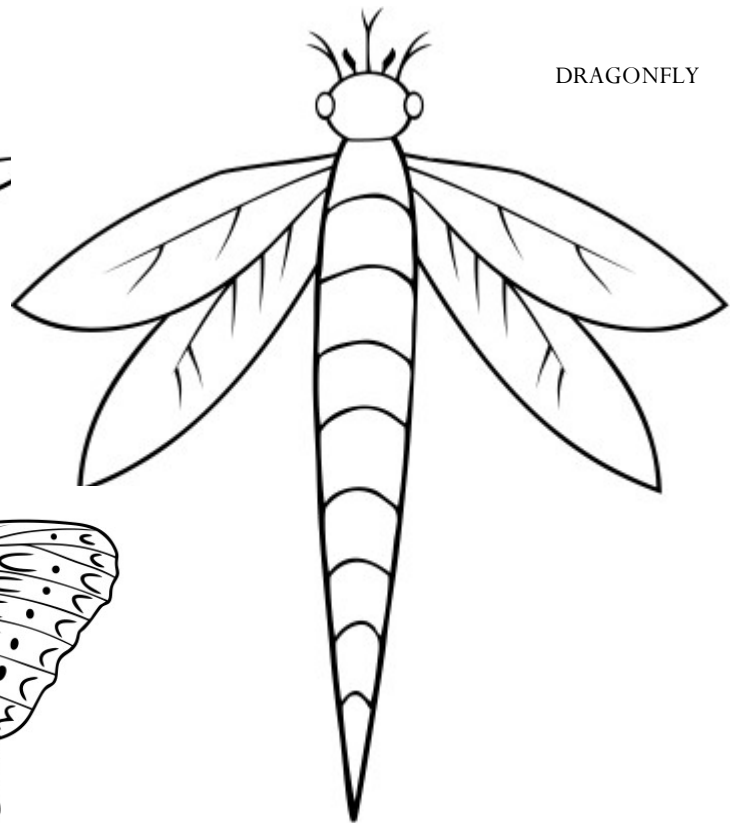

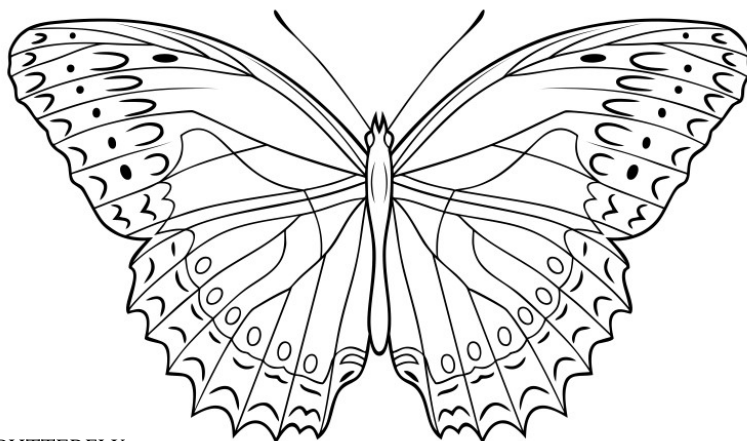
